

Otto Wyler, 1887-1965

- 31-3-1887 Born in Mumpf, Canton Aargau, Switzerland.
- 1892 Family moves to Aarau
- 1899 Diagnosed with a brain tumor at the age of twelve
- 1904-1905 Attends the "Fachschule fuer dekoratives Malen und Zeichnen" in Aarau, Studies drawing with E. Steimer.
- 1905 - 1906 Enrolls in de Ecole Nationale des Beaux-Arts in Paris, where he studies with F. Cormon, J.E.Blanche and Ch. Cottet.
- 1907 Resides in Germany and works with Heinrich Knirr
- 1908 Returns to Aarau, which becomes his permanent home.
- Wyler among the founders of the Aargau section of the " Gesellschaft Schweizerischer Maler Bildhauer und Architekten (GSMB) ". Participates in their yearly exhibitions.
- 1908 - 1917 Divides his time between Paris and Switzerland
- Takes part in several major international exhibitions throughout Europe, amongst others in Zurich, Berlin, Milan, Rome and Munich, where he is awarded a gold medal in 1913.
- 1917 Marries Betty Jaeger
- 1917-1923 Lives in Ftan, Engadin, Switzerland, during which time three of his four children are born
- 1918 Exhibition at Gallery Moos, Geneva
1921 Exhibition at Kunsthau Chur
- 1923 Moves back to Aarau
- Winter 1924 First stay in South of France
- 1927 Exhibition Florence, Italy
1931 Exhibition at Kunsthalle Bern
- 1925 -1934 Resides in Paris and South of France for several months
- 1934 and 1935 Two visits to Morocco
- 1938 Exhibition at St Gallen Art Museum
- 1940 -1946 Spent his winters in the village of Losone, Tessin, Switzerland.
- After 1945 Several stays in Greece and Italy

1943, 1954	Exhibitions at Luzern Art Museum
1955	Visits Israel
1961	Exhibition at Residenz Galerie Salzburg
1962 -1963	Comprehensive Jubilee exhibition for his 75th birthday, in which 222 works are exhibited at the Aarau Kunsthaus
1965	Continues to paint until the end of his life. Dies in Aarau at the age of 78.
1965+	Posthumous exhibitions amongst others in Galerie 6, Aarau
1987	Centennial exhibition in the Town Hall of Aarau.
